District	School	Grant Amount	Resources Funded
AOS 96 (Machias Public Schools)	Machias Memorial High School	\$2,000	Funded an air range top/oven to use to teach students skills on full preparation of healthier meals and lifestyle choices.
AOS 96 (Machias Public Schools)	Rose M. Gaffney	\$3,000	Funded raised garden with the goal of increasing quality of meals and incorporating more local produce into school menu, and a blender and other equipment to give educational demonstrations.
Bangor Public Schools	James F. Doughty School	\$2,500	Funded snack bins and snacks for classrooms to address hunger between meal times.
Bangor Public Schools	Bangor High School	\$2,500	Funded food for backpack program in order to address food insecurity during out of school time, especially weekends.
Brewer Public Schools	Brewer Community School	\$2,500	Funded food for the established school snack program in order to address hunger between meal times.
Brewer Public Schools	Brewer High School	\$2,500	Funded food for backpack program in order to address food insecurity during out of school time, during evening, weekend, and school vacations.
Calais Public Schools	Calais Middle/High School, Calais Alternative School	\$4,727	Funded the build out of a greenhouse to address food quality and increase amount of local fresh produce in school meals.
Lisbon Public Schools	Lisbon High School	\$2,500	Funded a "zero-waste" table (including a share table) and compost and recycling system to minimize food waste.
Lisbon Public Schools	Philip W. Sugg Middle School	\$2,500	Funded a school food and clothing pantry to give students access to free snacks outside of meal time, and clothing to take home.



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MSAD 54	Skowhegan Area High School & Skowhegan Area Middle School	\$1,216	Funded materials to give the cafeteria a facelift: menu boards and easels to better display and celebrate menu offerings, and a spice and coffee station to give students the option to customize their food and drinks.
RSU 03	Mount View High School/Mount View Middle School	\$5,000	Funded new sandwich prep station in school cafeteria in order to offer more tailored and healthy meal choices for students and to reduce wait time in line.
RSU 09 Mt Blue	Mt Blue High School, Mallet Elementary & Cascade Brook School	\$5,000	Funded the construction of a Free Food Closet, reinstating the backpack program for school vacations, and cup dispensers for water fountains so students can access water for free.
RSU 14	Windham Middle School	\$2,500	Funded 3 serving carts, 4 storage bins, and healthy snacks to stock food carts.
RSU 14	Windham High School	\$2,500	Funded a large 3 tiered food shelf and nutritious snacks to stock shelves to address hunger in between meal times.
Sanford School District	Sanford High School	\$603	Funded breakfast parfait samples to be given out during lunch period in order to raise awareness and provide education around the school nutrition programs.
Sanford School District	Sanford Middle School	\$4,397	Funded two grab n' go breakfast carts to increase access to breakfast, which will double as traveling breakfast carts once Covid restrictions loosen.
